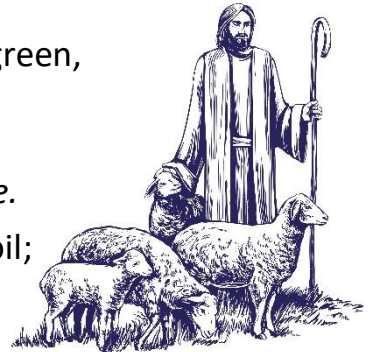
The Lord's my shepherd, I'll not want / he makes me lie in pastures green,

**Gospel Reading set for today:** John 10 v 22 – 30

### **Message from a Circuit friend**

Why won't God-fearing and God-loving people accept one another? Why are 'we' always right and 'they' always wrong. I found the pictures on our television screens of Jerusalem three weeks ago desperately sad. It so happened, you may remember, that the Muslim Ramadan, the Jewish Passover and the Christian Easter all coincided. And what were people doing – hugging and welcoming one another? No – throwing stones and other missiles and creating a riot. How that must grieve God. That was basically the same problem that faced Jesus in the gospel reading. There he was in the Temple and the religious authorities asked him yet again if he was the Christ. When he pointed out that he had already told them and proved it by his deeds they didn't want to know. This, of course, was because they had already made up their minds that he wasn't so it was very inconvenient to be faced with proof that he was. Jesus' comment that they do not believe is significant. The ancient Greek word translated 'believe' is not simply a cerebral word, a religious list you are asked to sign up to. It is

an active word better translated 'trust'. It has consequences. (You might believe your sat-nav works but that won't help you to get where you want to be unless you trust it and follow the directions.) Jesus makes this clear when he emphasises the consequences of trusting him. I find it really sad that the 'religious authorities' would have none of it – and this ultimately led to the cross. But also, the cross led to the resurrection. We need to make sure who we trust and then get on with the job. If you read your Bible carefully you will notice God doesn't give us much time for dithering about. Try Acts chapter 9 – the whole of it, not just Paul's conversion.
