#### Reflection

Day after day we are bombarded on all sides by people making claims about how easy it is to achieve everything we have ever wanted. If we want to have extra cash, we simply flog our much-loved possessions, get another credit card, borrow at exorbitant rates (if you read the small print), buy now and pay later the offers come thick and fast. If we want to have a slender body, then we simply buy certain foods, take certain exercises or buy certain clothes. If we want to have brilliant white teeth then we buy the latest brand of toothpaste and if we are gullible enough, we can easily believe that there is an easy solution to all our problems. Over a lifetime I have come to believe that there is no substitute for hard work, grit determination and discipline.

I often think that the disciples must have thought that all their birthdays had come at once, these were ordinary working men who under normal circumstances would have never bee considered to be academic enough to be discipled by a Rabbi, so that they might go on to become Rabbis themselves. Then this Jesus bloke comes along, and they are catapulted into the limelight. They don't appear to have earned that right, Jesus seems to have almost picked them at random, and they must have thought that they had found the easy fix. Jesus sets out what will be expected of the disciples if they want to with him. The journey for them will be costly and painful and Jesus does pack his punches when he talks about what lies ahead.

Poor old Jeremiah finds himself in a dreadful position. I am thankful that while there have been times in my journey of discipleship when life has been tough, God has never placed such demands on my ministry that Jeremiah faces, this is certainly not an easy fix. We are reminded that as St Paul writes this letter to Philemon appealing on behalf of Onesimus and we remember that while Paul was called personally by Jesus and has become the best known and most prolific evangelist for Christ. This was no quick fix, no easy ride, this was hard work.

This raises some important questions for the modern Church.

- What does your faith cost you?
- What is your relationship with God?
  - o Is it about what he can do for you?
  - o Do you feel that you have done your bit and now it is somebody else's turn?
- Are you ready to take up your cross every day and walk in his footsteps?

We ask your comforting hand on those who feel desperate, who struggle to hold on to routine, rhythm or hope, on all whose health is failing, on those who feel their powers to be waning as they become more dependent on others.

Give each of us, and those around us, the courage to act with grace, clarity and humanity.

Living, loving God, guide us this day, that we might be a part of your kingdom, a piece in your puzzle, a player in your story.
