## Matthew 17 : 1-9

### Reflection

I wonder what it was like to have met and listened to Jesus as he walked and talked, healed those who were ill and stood up to those who felt threatened by his presence. Maybe I would be proud, and sometimes bewildered, to be selected as part of his group of disciples. How would I feel not to be part of his closest group? A little bit resentful, perhaps, or relieved that I was in a less-demanding position. What must it have been like to be Peter, James or John? Always being taken to one side to hear some deeper thoughts and trying, not always successfully, to make sense of what Jesus was saying.

On this particular day, Jesus took Peter, James and John up a hill and then became 'different'. He looked amazing, bright shining like the sun! And there, talking with Jesus, were two others, Moses and Elijah. Peter, in his usual, impetuous way, became quite excited about what they could do to provide shelters for the prophets and Jesus. Then it all changed. A cloud came over them, accompanied by a voice, and excitement was replaced by fear. Jesus speaks those words, so often heard, 'Don't be afraid.' And then, that final instruction, 'Don't tell anyone what you have seen until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.' How difficult would that be?

I wonder, would I be a bystander, a closer disciple, or privy to Jesus' most precious moments? Would I be excited, afraid, or reassured, and would I be wanting to tell the world what I have experienced?

## Reflection

Never have we had to be more wary. Nowadays we seem to be surrounded by fakes and scams whether it is on social media, eBay, emails, the internet or phone calls. All of them claiming to be something that they are not; either cheap copies or out and out scams. It is sad when we have to question the veracity of every email, phone call and advert.

The lectionary readings today from Isaiah and Matthew take up that theme. Isaiah was writing at a time of exile in Babylon but was critical of the direction worship and religion had taken. People looked the part; they practiced all the right ceremonies of worship. They fasted and even lay on sackcloth and ashes but inside nothing had changed. They wanted God to act for them but at the same time exploited the poor and helpless and fought amongst themselves.

In Matthew chapter 5, Jesus questions the righteousness of the Pharisees and teachers of the law. Again, they followed every minute law from their scriptures but missed the whole point of why they were doing so. The outward show had not resulted in an inward change. Jesus takes that a lot further in Matthew 23. The woes!

One reason that the church and Christianity are seen as an irrelevance by many today is precisely that. Sexual scandals, abuse by clergy, millionaire preachers and Christian politicians who only care for themselves confirm opinions that the faith they profess is skin deep. It has not made any real difference.

That is why the first part of the Matthew reading is so vital. Jesus tells us that as his followers we are the salt and light of the earth. In other words, we make a real difference to the situations we find ourselves in as we demonstrate Gods compassion and love to those around us. As Christians we are how others judge Christ. Has he made a difference to our lives? Are we the real thing?

## Prayer of response and Intercession

Lord, in the dank dreariness of winter we long for warmth and light. In our confusion, we turn to you. We pray for the powerful and the influential, that they may be servants of the common good. In a world of deep fakes and deceptions, we seek your truth, your light, your will for us, your people. Help us to be truly holy, set apart for you in service to others.
